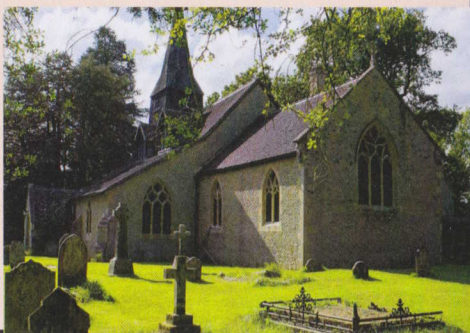
Transform Your Church's Future

From the Vicar – Work and Rest (An article from Parish Pump)

*August sees many of us taking holidays to get some well-earned rest from working. But what is the biblical relationship between rest and work? The Bible shows us that **we are to work from rest, not rest from work.** How is this working out in our current experience?*

When God created human beings on the 6th day, the next full day was a day of rest before the work began: *'Then God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it He rested from all the work of creating that He had done.'* (Genesis 2:3). Sunday is a day of rest at the beginning of the week.

Jesus lived out this rhythm of rest and work in His own ministry: *'Very early in the morning, Jesus got up and went off to a solitary place, where He prayed'* He then told His disciples: *'Let us go somewhere else so that I can preach there also. That is why I have come.'* (Mark 1:35-38).

Here is a rhythm for our own lives: 'I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in Me and I in you, you will bear much fruit' (John 15:5). Our work/fruitfulness arises out of the time we abide/rest in Jesus. He will then show us what aspects of our lives need pruning: 'while every branch that does bear fruit He prunes so that it will be even more fruitful.' (2).

Let's use this month to reflect on how this pattern is working in our lives:

Are we spending enough time 'abiding' in Jesus?

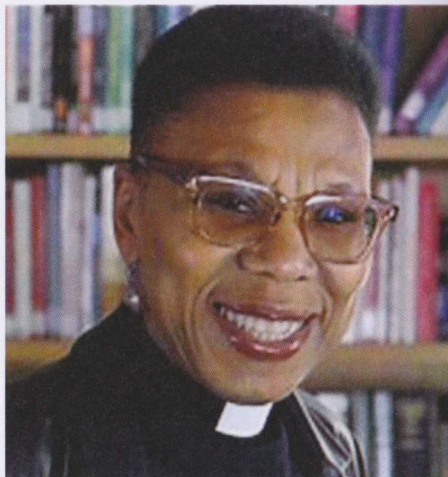
Are we putting our energies into the right balance of rest and work?

Are there unproductive areas of our lives and churches that need pruning?

Remember God created us as *human beings* not just *human doings*!!

Appointment of the Rt Revd Dr Rosemarie Mallett

Downing Street recently announced that Her Majesty the Queen has approved the appointment of the Venerable Dr Rosemarie Mallett, Archdeacon of Croydon, as Bishop of Croydon in the Diocese of Southwark. She succeeds the Rt Revd Jonathan Clark who left the Diocese in March. Dr Mallett is the first female Bishop in the Diocese. She will be the second Barbadian Bishop of Croydon – the first being the Rt Revd Wilfred Wood who served as Bishop from 1985 to 2003. He was the first black Bishop in the Church of England. Dr Mallett was consecrated at Southwark Cathedral on Friday 24 June..



Born in Barbados, Dr Mallett grew up in the UK and was educated at Sussex University and Warwick University. Prior to ordination, she was a research sociologist and academic, specialising in international development and ethno-cultural mental health. She has lived and worked in Tanzania, Ethiopia and Barbados. She trained for ministry at the South East Institute of Theological Education (SEITE) and served her curacy at Christ Church, Brixton Road. She was ordained Priest in 2005.

Dr Mallett served as Priest-in-Charge at St John the Evangelist, Angell Town, from 2007 and was appointed Vicar in 2013, as well as being made Director of Ordinands for the Kingston Episcopal Area. In 2015, she was additionally appointed Diocesan Director of Justice, Peace and the Integrity of Creation. She served on General Synod from 2011 to 2021.

She is the Diocesan lead on Racial Justice and authored the Diocese of Southwark's Anti-Racism Charter which was unanimously approved by the Diocesan Synod in March 2021. Dr Mallett regularly appears on BBC Radio Four's Prayer for the Day and has led Daily Worship on BBC Radio Four. She is a spokesperson on racial and social justice issues nationally.

For more than 20 years, Dr Mallett has served as Trustee and Director of a number of social action charities across London, all focusing on building community cohesion. She served as Equalities Commissioner for five years in Lambeth, and currently acts as adviser to a Croydon community action project which is focused on reducing serious youth violence. We look forward to welcoming our new bishop at St Peter's in the near future

I attended the recent service to ordain and consecrate the new Bishop of Croydon, the Rt Reverend Dr Mallett. Bishops have a wide responsibility, so rarely do they visit our churches in the normal pattern of services and usually they come alone. So, it was strange, sitting behind rows of bishops in their red robes, from dioceses near and far, come to support their new colleague. One I caught up with after the service was 'our own' Andrew Rumsey, Bishop of Ramsbury. He said memories of Oxted and Tandridge are precious to him, especially Tandridge.



It is over three years since he was elevated to Salisbury Diocese, and life goes well for the Rumsey family; especially now that there is a new Bishop of Salisbury and Andrew can hand back the extra responsibilities he has had. All the family are flourishing; Grace is established in Drama and Arts at Cardiff University; Jonah hopes to study Physics and Philosophy at Bristol, and Tali will be moving to the Sixth Form in the autumn. Andrew sent his love to Tandridge.

Memories of the Coronation Day

1953: Seventy years ago, was a very memorable year for me as I had just arrived back from Hong Kong to make arrangements for our wedding in August and, as it so happened, I would be celebrating my 21st birthday as well witnessing the importance and excitement of the Coronation.



Tony's aunt and uncle, who lived in Hampstead, had recently acquired a television set and invited us, together with other members of his family, to watch the Coronation with them. We gathered round this new television set, which was in black and white and quite small. How special it was to watch the service from St Paul's Cathedral celebrating the Queen's 70 years on the throne in glorious technicolour on a big screen. Nevertheless, we were all excited to have a somewhat grandstand view of the ceremony, especially as it was raining and being a gathering, we generated our own excitement and anticipation.

Having watched the coach leave Buckingham Palace on its way to Westminster Abbey, we all settled down to a sandwich lunch and, of course, a glass of wine. The rain didn't dampen our enthusiasm, nor that of the crowd lining the Mall and up to Westminster Abbey. The Coronation service itself was very moving and in many ways it was quite emotive to see this very young queen take on this historic and very religious role. We saw Prince Charles being cared for by the Queen Mother and Prince Philip paying homage to his wife and queen, a moment I will always remember. It was all so very special and I felt very privileged to actually feel I was participating in this historic event, albeit via television. It was amazing and will be etched on my memory forever. How fortunate we were, especially to have the facility of a television.

Later that day we went up to Buckingham Palace with some cousins and managed, with a little bit of manoeuvring, to secure places by the palace gates and saw the Queen and Prince Philip come out onto the balcony with various members of the Royal Family, including Prince Charles and Princess Anne. The cheering from the crowd was overwhelming and the Queen and Prince Philip appeared several times. I still remember how close we were to the balcony as we could see them all so clearly. When you see these pictures on television, you don't realise how close the balcony is when the Royal Family appear there. As you can imagine, we were reluctant to leave our wonderful position, but realised after two or three repeat appearances that they were not coming out again.



After this general excitement, we joined the crowd and had a wonderful party outside on the Mall. We made so many new friends and the atmosphere was electric with happiness and cheer. We didn't want to leave and end this memorable day, but it had been a long and exciting day and suddenly we were tired, so went home on a wave of euphoria.

Seventy years ago and, for me, what a year 1953 was with the Coronation of our Queen, Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay conquering Everest and then the Hopkins being married in London!

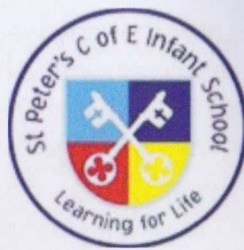

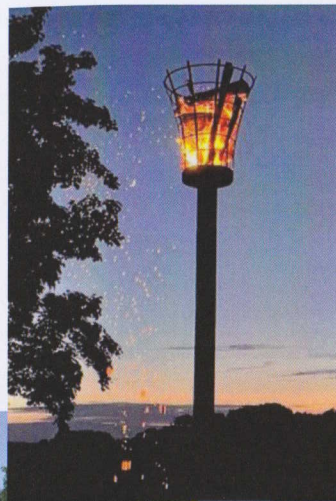
plaque was unveiled with a poem written for the Jubilee by Ruth D'Alessandro. See page 18.

Paschal Candle Stand in St Peter's

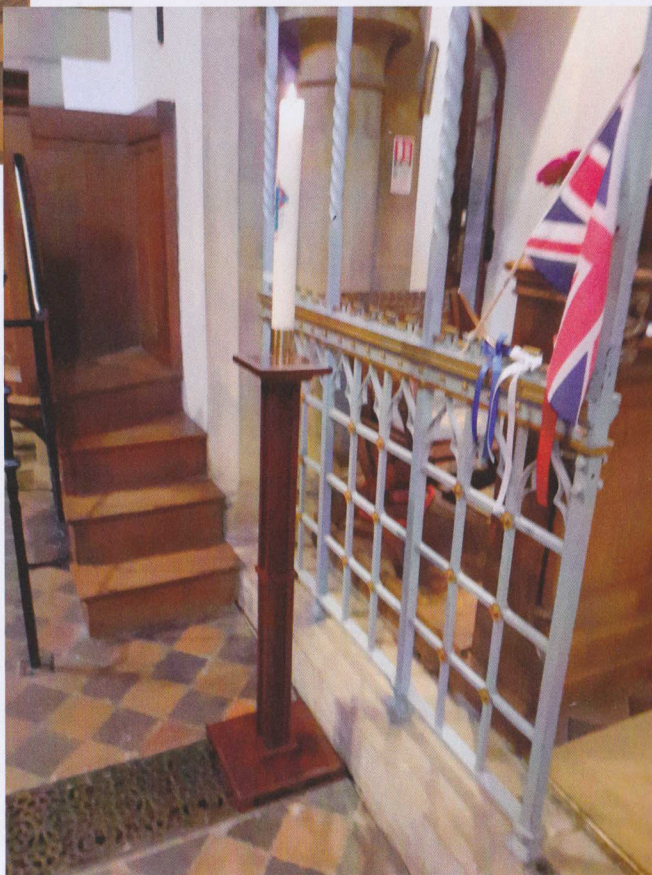
St Peter's are the custodians of a new Paschal Candle Stand which was given to St Peter's by Lynne and Martin Lloyd in remembrance of Lynne's late mother, Jill Perry.

The Paschal candle is often decorated with symbols of Christ's resurrection, such as a cross or an image of the resurrected Christ. The Paschal candle also represents Jesus' resurrection and triumph over death, and is a symbol of hope and new life. The Candle has a long history and carries significant meaning and symbolism in Easter services. The candle is lit during the Easter Vigil, symbolizing the darkness of the tomb. The Paschal Candle is also lit

during baptisms, signifying new life in Christ.

Up until now, the Paschal candle, which was introduced to St Peter's in 1998, used an old wooden floor standing candle stick which had seen 'better days'.

The new candle stick will be used for the first time on 13th August at the baptism of Jill Perry's great granddaughter.

Ukraine Update—11 July 2022

Since 4th March, ten full van loads of aid have been sent from Hurst Green via the registered charity, British Humanitarian Aid, for Ukraine. The early loads were dispatched to the refugee centres in Zamosc, Poland, but more recently, lorries have been able to drive directly into the north of Ukraine, to Chernihiv.

Between August 2021 and February 2022, Penny Kirk was sending aid to Ukraine via this charity but bluntly, the load face was typically those items which we could not home in the UK and would otherwise end up here in landfill. Items previously included – bedding, duvets, pillows, blankets, towels, cot mattresses, moses basket mattresses, school uniforms, potties.

Since the war began, the load face necessarily changed and our local community has contributed generously. Just from Penny's home address, we have been able to send over 40,000 nappies, over 7,000 colouring books with packs of crayons, mini toiletries (including over 1,000 mini soaps) and thousands of packs of sanitary products, as well as over 300 pots of multivitamins.

The latest loads have focused on requests received for food and since 23rd June, over 6,000 tins of food have been dispatched with bags of rice and pasta.



The local community donated over £3,000 to support Penny's request to purchase sanitary products and all that money has been used to target items purchased at the lowest prices, in order to achieve the greatest volume of supplies and to get the most from people's cash donations. Many in the community have offered to help pack, sort and label supplies, as well as load the vans which Penny says has proved invaluable – if it isn't packed and

labelled properly, it doesn't go!

Positive confirmation has been received of the aid arriving safely in Ukraine and families have expressed their gratitude for the gifts they have received. Each item dispatched from Hurst Green has a label in Ukrainian stuck to the goods which translates to read "with love from your friends in England."

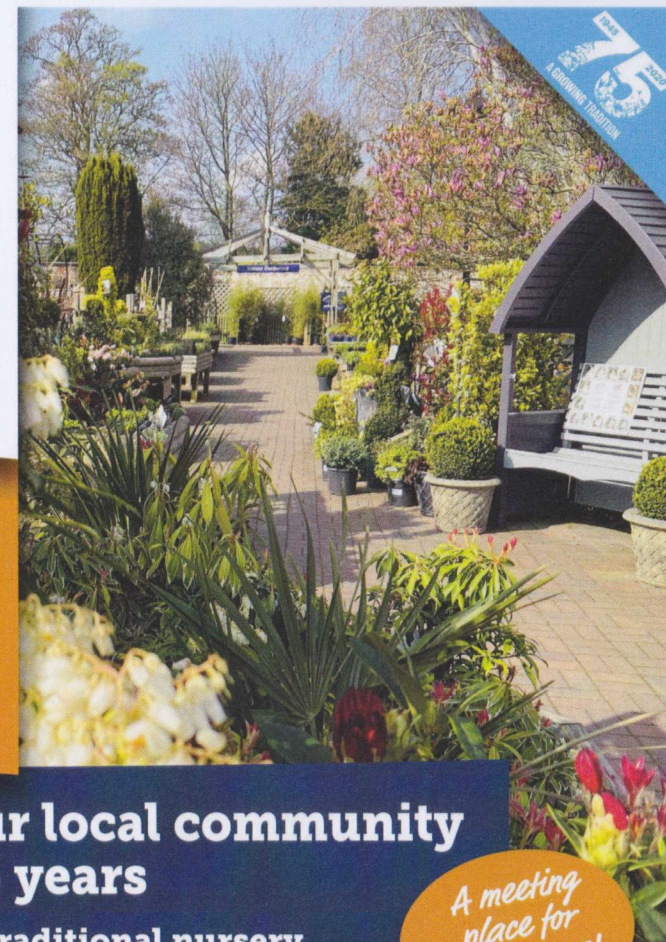
